Friday, 10th to Sunday, 12h February 2017

Friday, 10th February

We met up for a 5 mile walk from the hotel, through the Deer Park and the castle grounds to Gallox Bridge. We then climbed and followed the Bat's Castle Circuit for a while before turning off on the Bratton path. We then climbed up to arrive at Bat's Castle and on to Withycmbe Gate. After our sightings of deer on the last Walking Group Weekend we were keen to see them again but they were nowhere to be seen.

Disappointed, we walked down Park Lane to Carhampton Gate and down through the fields – admiring the old English cattle - back to Gallox Bridge. We had good views of Dunster Castle and ended our walk with tea and teacakes

Saturday, 11 February

We headed off in the same direction as Friday to join Park Lane and on to Long Combe. We followed woodland paths and tracks to the highest part of our walk – in the snow – and on to the remains of the old settlement of Clicket. The path back took us over Croydon HII and to Timberscmbe. We walked back over the field and woodland paths to Withycombe Gate, Park Lane and Carhampton Gate and our walk home. This was a long walk of 14 miles. Very cold and with snow but a most enjoyable day.

We previously walked the Black Hill Circuit on an earlier Walking Group Weekend where we saw lots of carved anilnals. We were surprised to see this carved rabbit in the snow
